


- Pre 1793- slavery is dying business b/c of...


 Cotton Problems


 Description:
- 1793- cotton gin (Whitney)
 profitable and easier
 more land, slaves
- South = ½ of world supply of cotton
 made other countries dependent (England)
 felt England would support South in war









Overall Characteristics • 1860- 4 million slaves in plantation South • natural reproduction • planter investment = \$2 billion • investment = safe jobs







Work Conditions

- 15-16 hrs a day
- 1/2 on Saturday, off on Sunday

Work Roles

- field work
- butlers, drivers, mechanics, craftsmen
- women seamstress, cooks, maids



Work Organization

- gang system
 - white or black overseer
 - supervised 20-25 adults
 - widely used on cotton plantations
- task system
 - specific daily assignments for each slave • work at own pace, little supervision required
 - most common on rice plantations

Slave Resistance

- Making life bearable
 - work slowly
 - stole food
 - sabotage equipment
