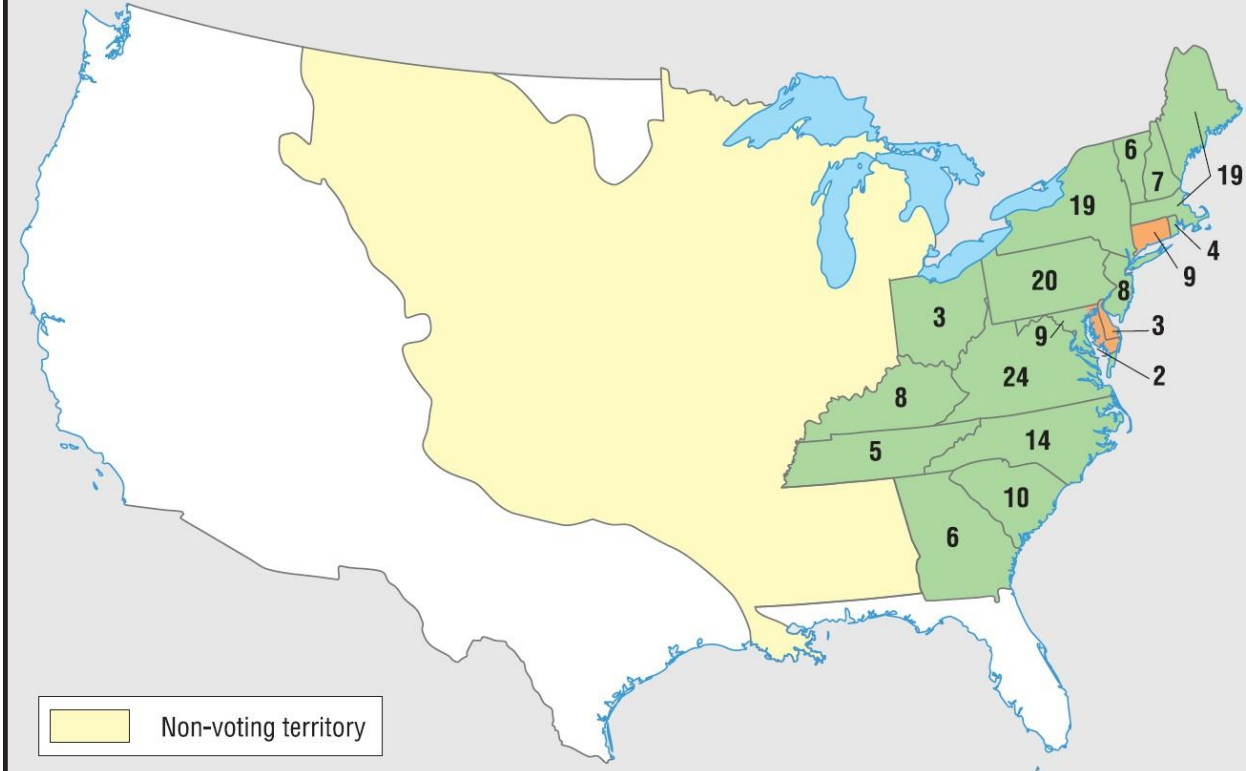

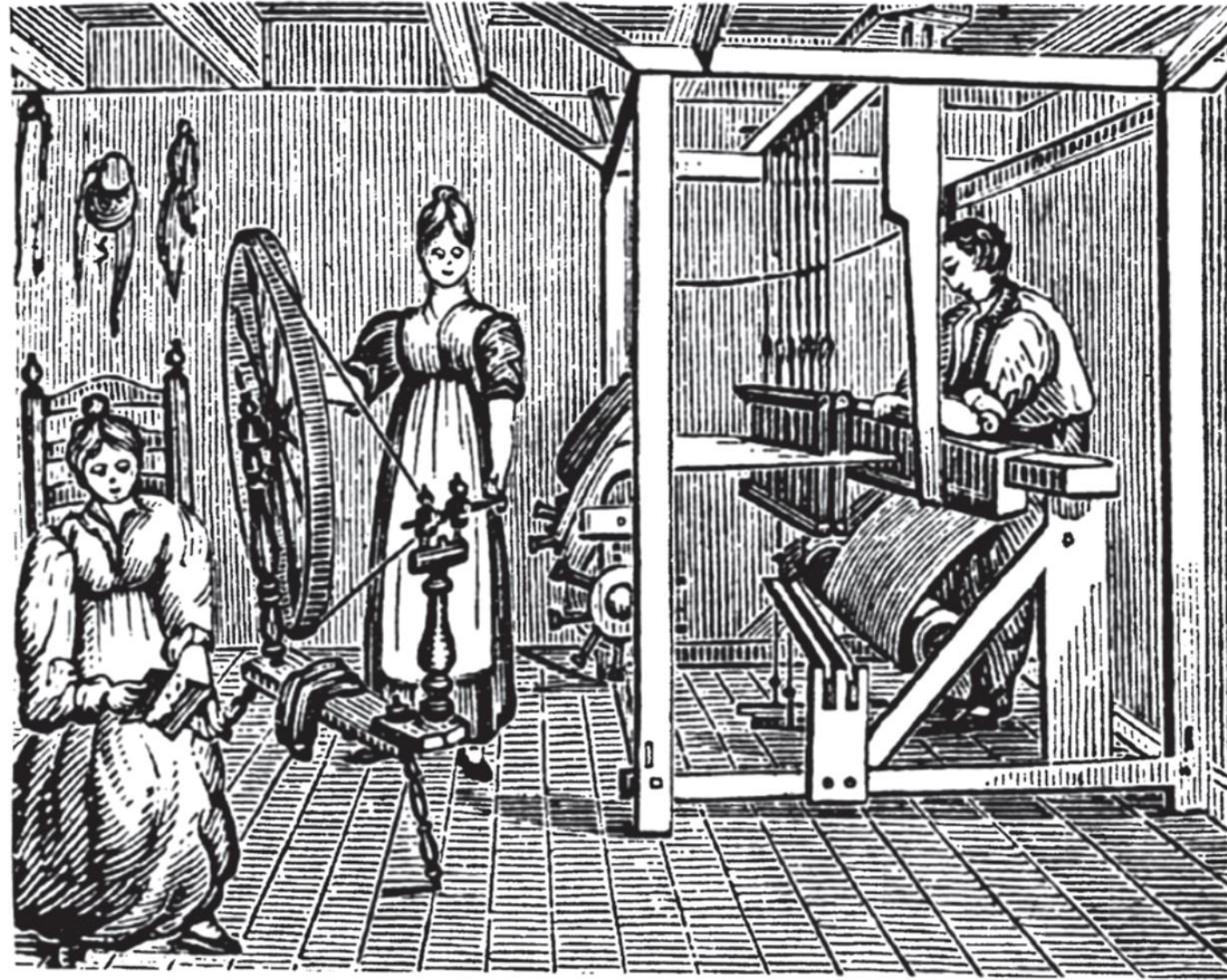


OGRABME, or. The American Snapping-turtle.

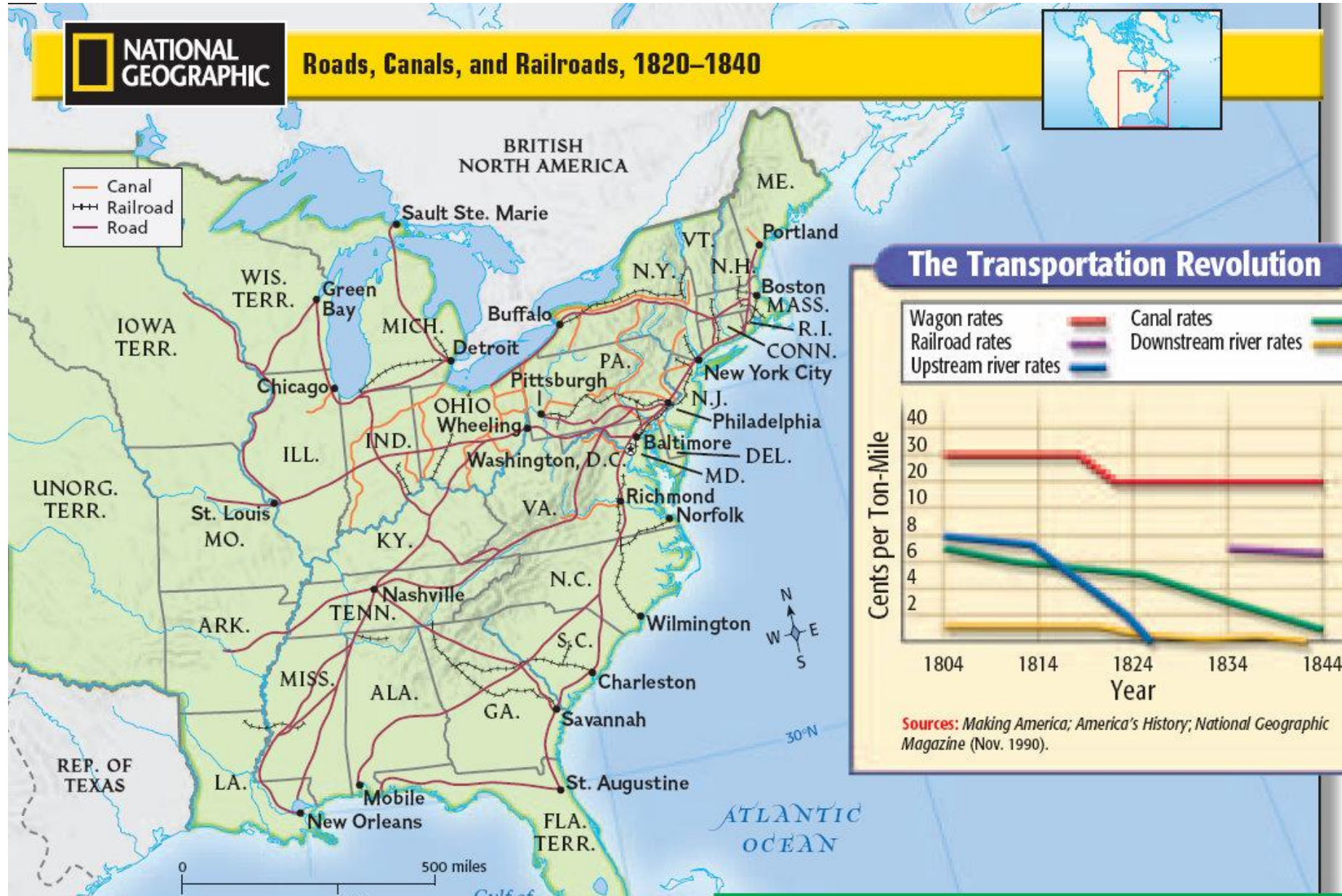


Principal Rivers, Roads, and Canals, 1840

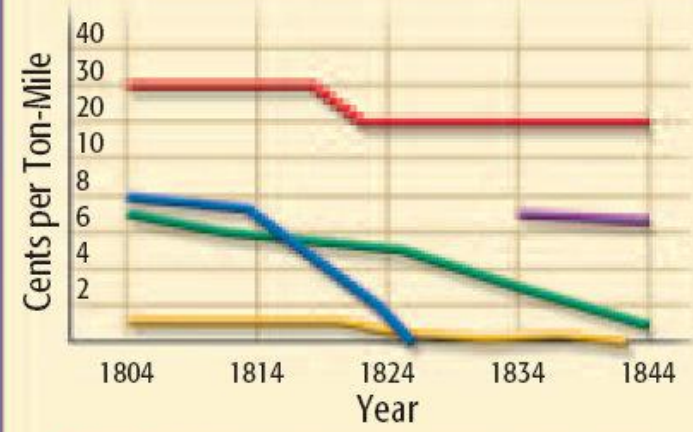




Roads, Canals, and Railroads, 1820-1840

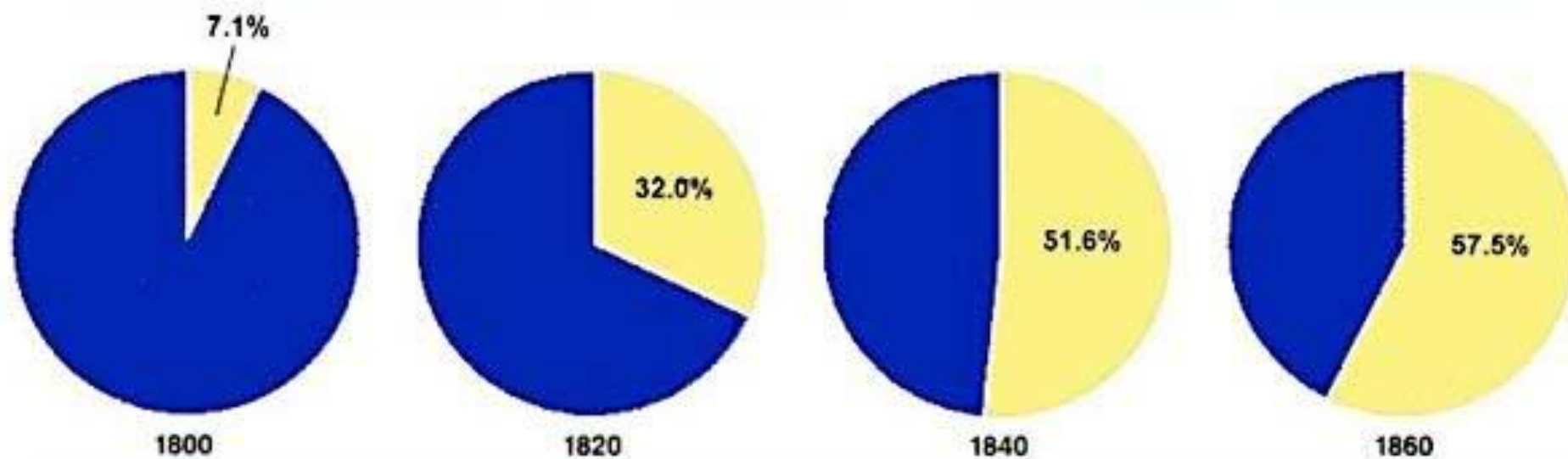

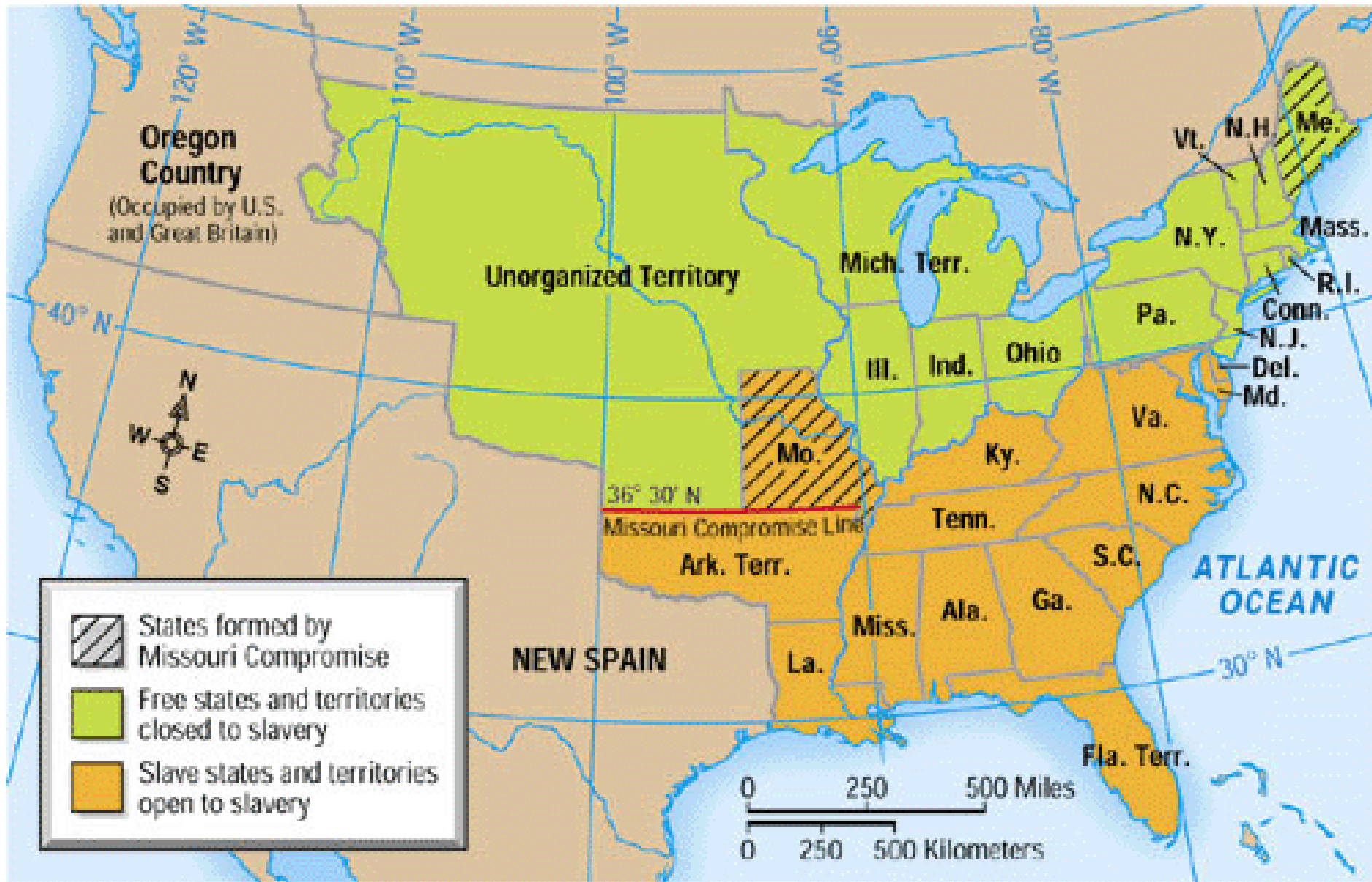

By 1840 cotton accounted for more than half of all U.S. Exports.





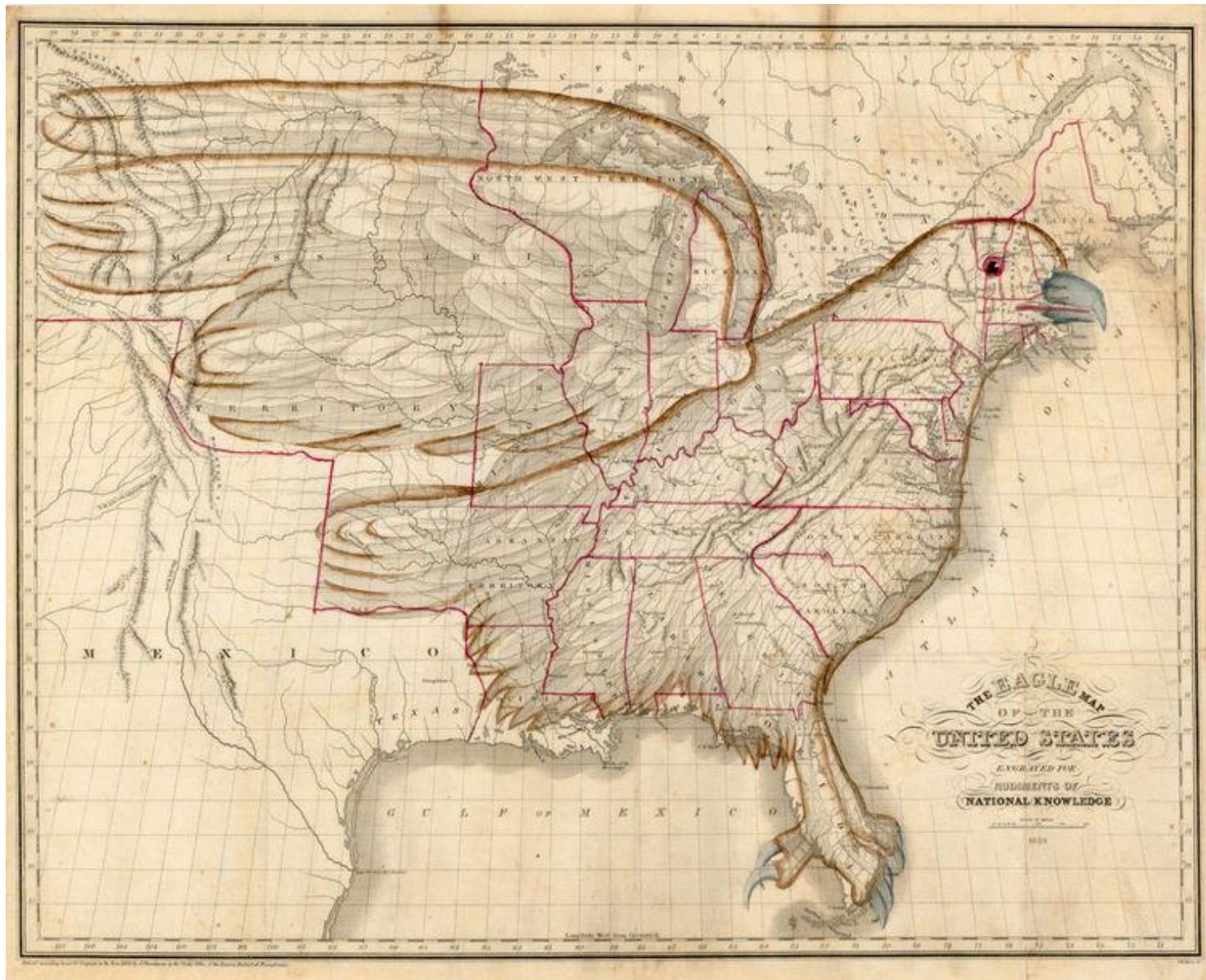

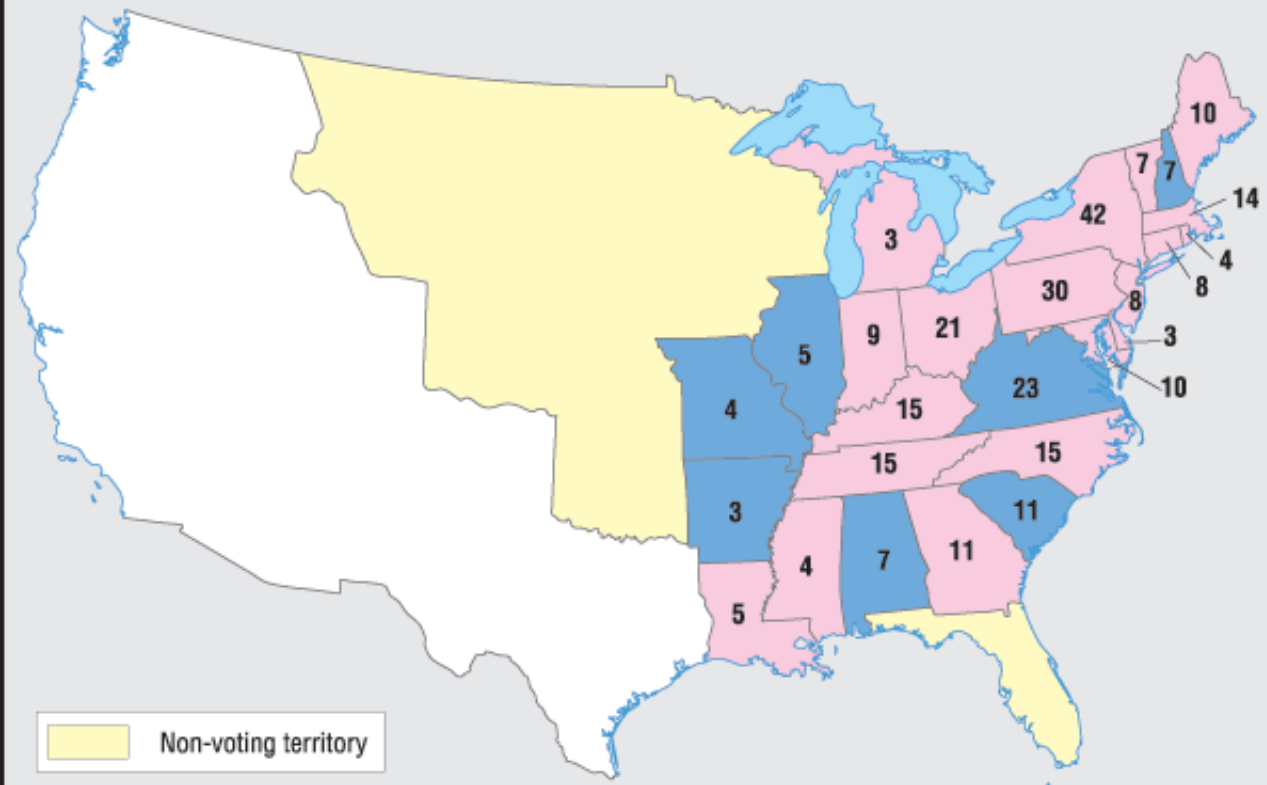

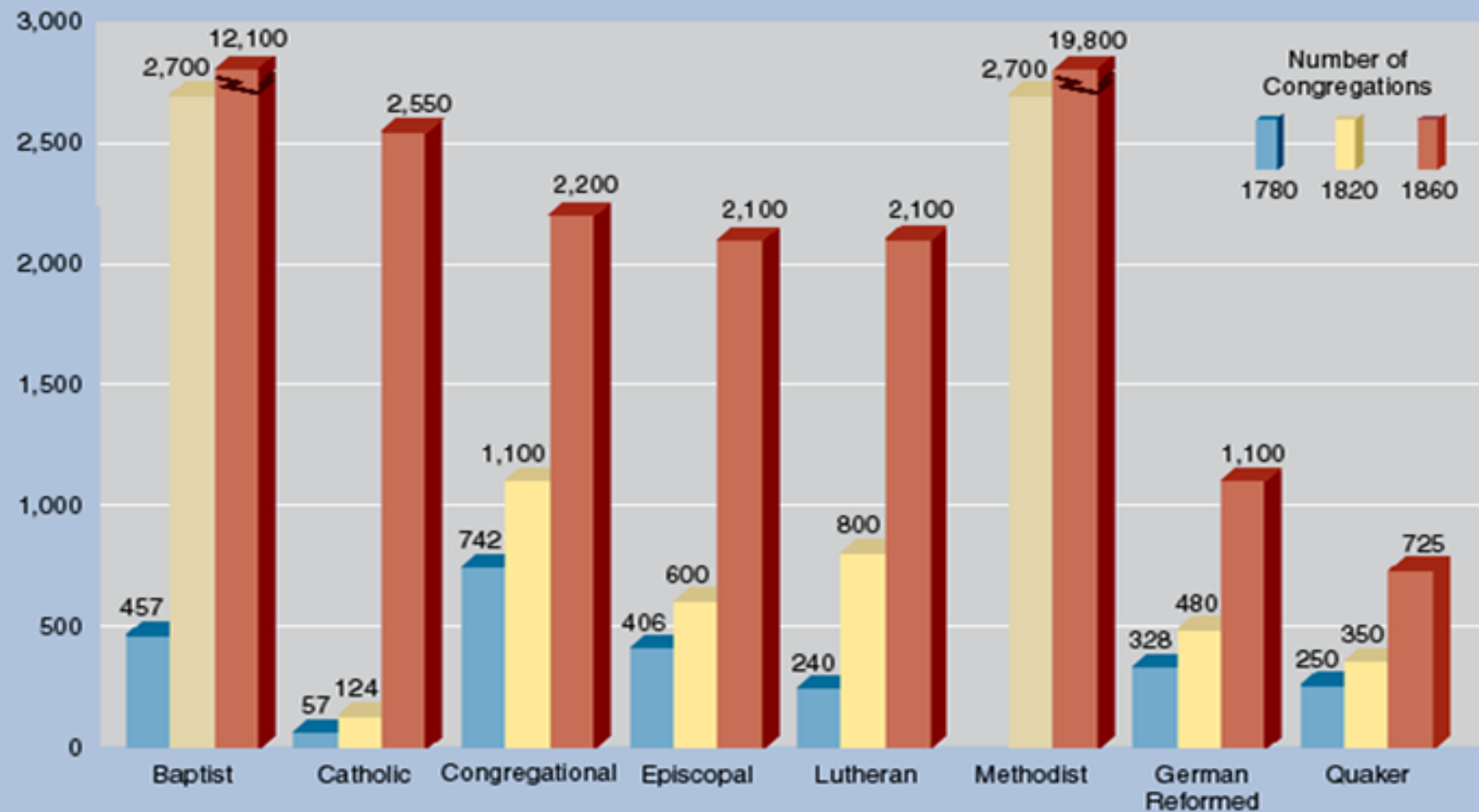

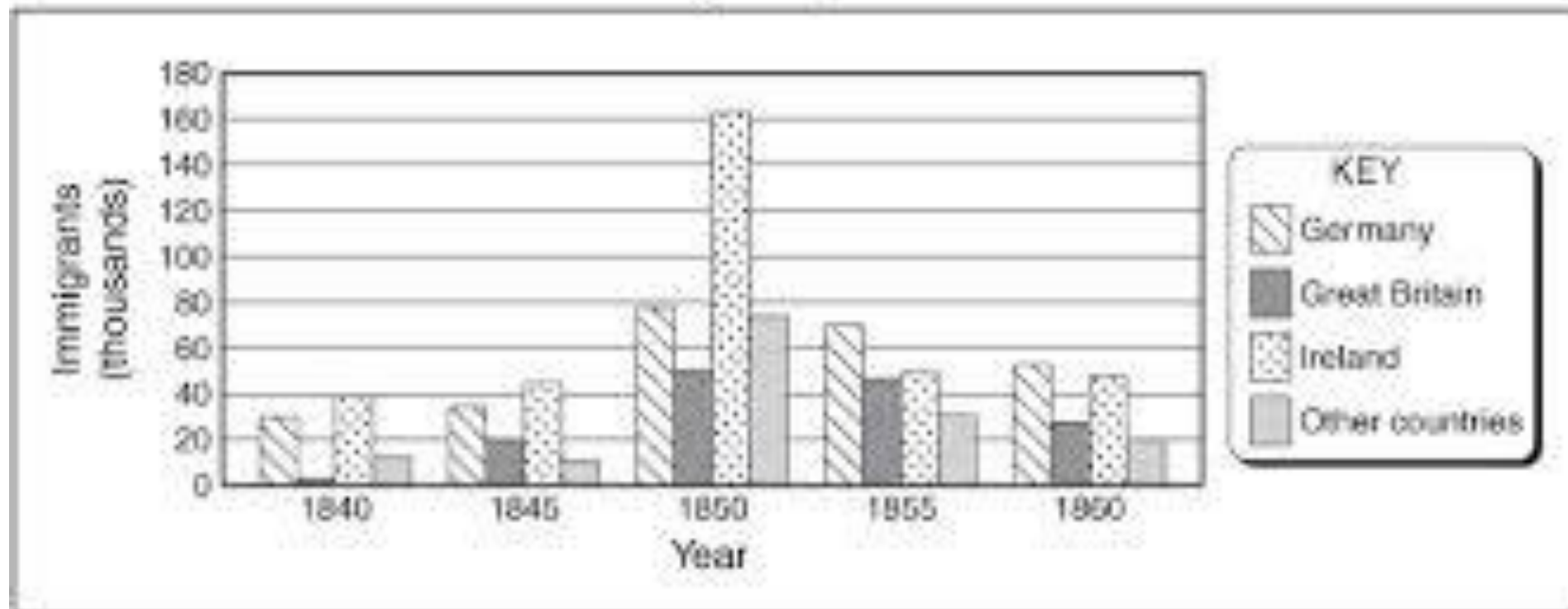
