Pre-Reform Russia

- Napoleon's failed invasion
 created new concern for defense

• fell behind industrialized nations

• still predominantly agricultural • serfdom

- Crimean War (1854-56)
- Cause
 conflict w/ Ottomans over Holy Land
- Events
 - British, French join Ottomans
 Russia loses due to industrial advantages of West

Context

• 1600s – Tokugawa Edicts

Causes

- Arrival of Commodore Matthew Perry (1853)
- \bullet attempt to force Japan to trade with US merchant ships
- Japan has to agree (no navy)
 Treaty of Kanagawa (1854)
 opened Japanese ports
 ends isolation

 Effect
 showed that Tokugawa were weak - shower that roughts were weak
 - 1868 – overthrown by samurai
 - re-establishment of imperial authority
 - sends Japan into an unprecedented era of modernization and industrialism
