


- Calls for reform



Booker T. Washington and W.E.B. DuBois Washington

- · born in slavery in Virginia in 1858
- · principal of Tuskegee Institute, Alabama
- · taught manual job skills like masonry and carpentry
- became most influential black leader with Atlanta Compromise speech in 1895 which downplayed importance of civil rights and social equality in favor of economic and educational advances for African Americans

DuBois

- · born in Massachusetts in 1868
- · first African American to earn PhD from Harvard in 1895
- · taught at Wilberforce and Atlanta Universities
- wrote Souls of Black Folk criticizing Washington
- · emphasized vigorous protest against racial injustice
