

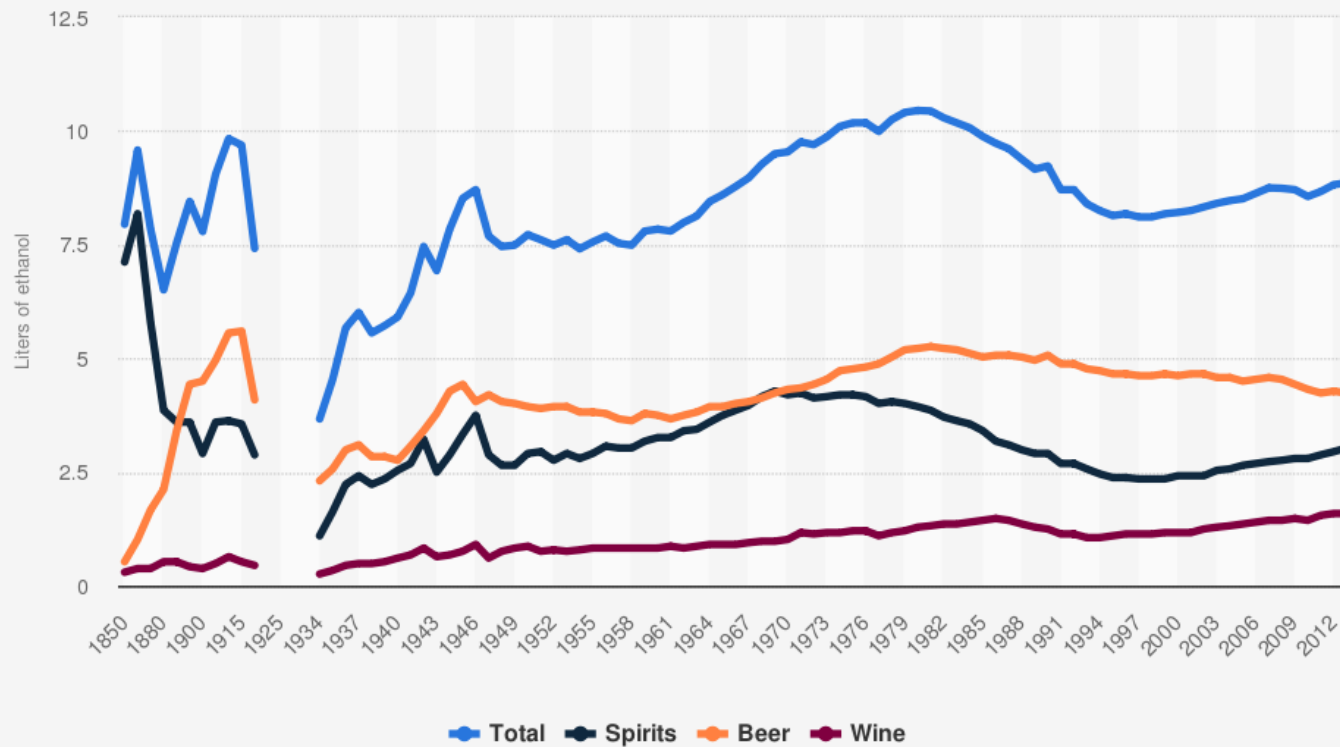

Annual alcohol consumption per capita by type of alcoholic beverage in the United States from 1850 to 2013 (in liters of ethanol)

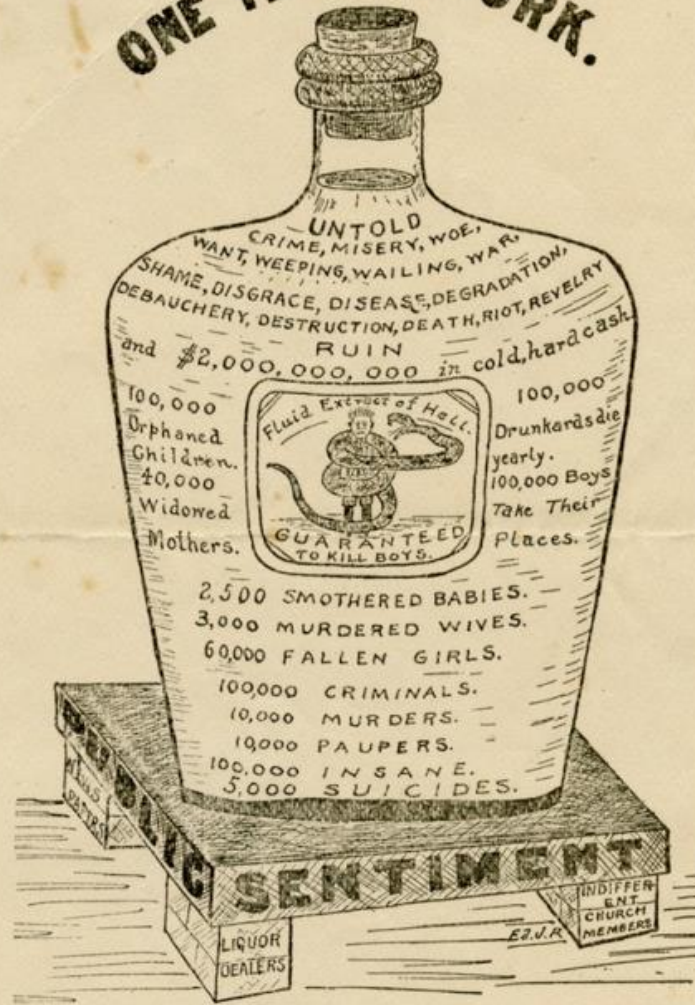

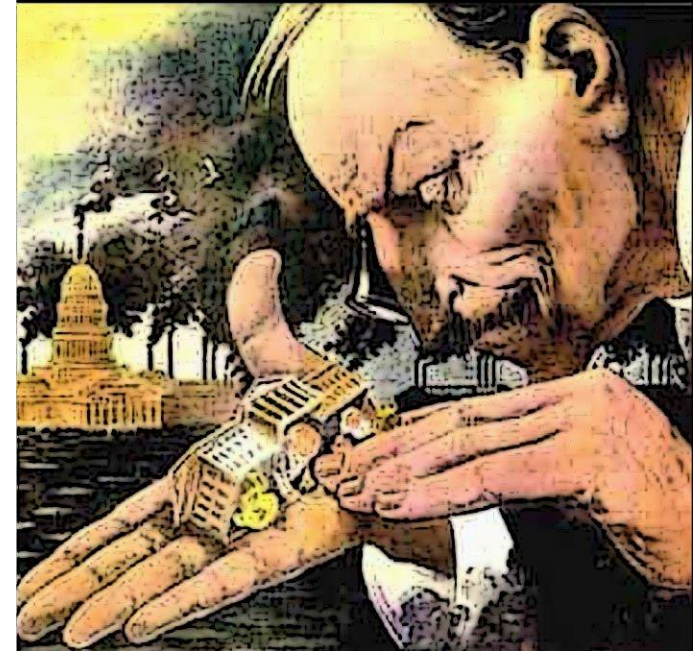

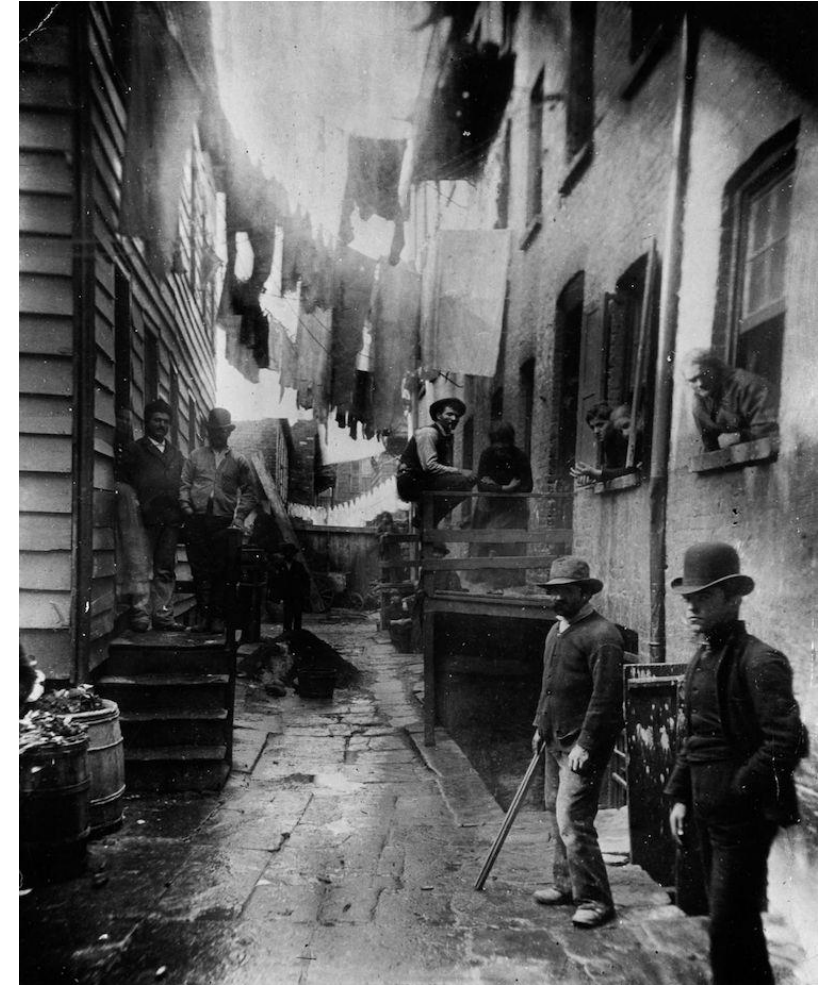

# African Americans



## Booker T. Washington and W.E.B. DuBois

### Washington

- born in slavery in Virginia in 1858
- principal of Tuskegee Institute, Alabama
- taught manual job skills like masonry and carpentry
- became most influential black leader with Atlanta Compromise speech in 1895 which downplayed importance of civil rights and social equality in favor of economic and educational advances for African Americans

### DuBois

- born in Massachusetts in 1868
- first African American to earn PhD from Harvard in 1895
- taught at Wilberforce and Atlanta Universities
- wrote *Souls of Black Folk* criticizing Washington
- emphasized vigorous protest against racial injustice
