



Problems Ruling Africa cost enormous amounts to rule large land areas solution = indirect rule



Evidences of Abuse Roger Casement member of British consular service reported on abuses in Belgian-ruled Congo Casement: "How much did you get paid for this?" Audience: "We got no pay. We got nothing." One local: "Our village got John and a little salt, but not the people who did the work. Our chief ate up the cloth; the workers got nothing...! use to take ten day to get the twenty baskets of rubber- we were always in the forest to find the rubber vines, to go without food, and our women had to give up cultivating the gardens. Then we starved.
